Simon Elliott

Simon has a Bachelor of Science degree in Biochemistry (with Honours) and a PhD in Biochemical Toxicology and is professionally qualified as a Chartered Scientist, Member of the Royal Society of Chemistry, Registered Toxicologist with the Institute of Biology and British Toxicology Society, Eurotox European Registered Toxicologist and Member of the Forensic Science Society.

Simon has over 15 years experience in clinical and forensic toxicology and has published over 30 articles in international scientific journals and presented cases and papers at international meetings. He has also acted as a technical advisor to The World Health Organisation and European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction.

Julie Evans

Consultant Forensic Toxicologist and Operations Director, Julie has been a practising Forensic Scientist specialising in toxicology for more than 27 years, primarily with The Forensic Science Service. Julie is a Chartered Chemist and Member of the Royal Society of Chemistry with professional membership of the Forensic Science Society and has served as an Authorised Analyst under the provisions of Section 16 of the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988.

As an expert toxicologist, Julie specialises in hair analysis, collaborating with internationally renowned experts and practitioners to publish in peer reviewed international technical journals. In the past 5 years Julie has co-authored 5 papers on the use of hair testing in the investigation of use and abuse of drugs.

With significant expert witness experience in Civil, Crown, Magistrates and HM Coroner's courts, Julie leads our Drugs in Hair Testing service.

Eleanor Miller

Drugs in Hair Testing Laboratory Manager, Eleanor graduated with a First class Masters in Forensic and Analytical Chemistry from the University of Strathclyde in 2004. Eleanor went on to complete a PhD in Forensic Toxicology at the University of Glasgow in 2007 and was awarded a Diploma in Forensic Medical Sciences by the Society of the Apothecaries in 2008. The main focus of her PhD research was the analysis of drugs of abuse in hair which resulted in five publications in peer reviewed journals. Following her PhD, Eleanor joined The University of Glasgow with responsibility in the Drugs of Abuse Hair Testing Section and her work included the preparation of interpretative toxicology reports for use in Court.

After six months, Eleanor took the opportunity to pursue a two and a half year postdoctoral fellowship at the Center for Human Toxicology at The University of Utah, USA before joining ROAR in January 2011. Whilst in Utah, Eleanor conducted intensive collaborative research funded by the U.S. National Cancer Institute and developed several international research collaborations with academia and industry. Eleanor has published 10 papers in a variety of peer-reviewed international journals and reviewed several others for publication. Eleanor is Member of The Royal Society of Chemistry (MRSC), The Society of Forensic Toxicologists (SOFT) and Society of Hair Testing (SoHT).

Dr Pascal Kintz

Dr Kintz is widely recognised as a leading global authority on drugs in hair testing with many years experience of developing the science and publishing internationally on the subject. Dr Kintz first graduated as a Pharmacist at the University of Strasbourg in 1985 and after a period of research in molecular pharmacology, undertook his PhD on analytical methods for drugs of abuse at the Louis Pasteur University, Strasbourg.

Dr Kintz has held positions as Associate Professor of Legal Medicine (1990-2004), Associate Director of the Institute of Legal Medicine of Strasbourg (1990-2004) and joined Chemtox Laboratory in 2004 where he became the Head of Scientific Affairs before leaving in 2010. Dr Kintz is now a senior consultant in Forensic Toxicology and specifically Drugs in Hair Testing.

Dr Kintz has a well established and truly international perspective on Drugs in Hair Testing: he is a Past President and current Member of the International Association of Forensic Toxicologists (TIAFT); Founding Member and current President of the Society of Hair Testing (SoHT); Member of the Gesellschaft für Toxicologische und Forensische Chemie (Germany); Member of the Society of Forensic Toxicologists (USA) and is a certified 'Expert' for the French and German legal systems.

Dr Kintz has written over 300 papers and edited 5 books in two languages on this subject and is a regular guest speaker at scientific meetings and conferences around the world.
